

This month also required designs for the new Writer in Residence, Elaine Powers, a new program Nourish and Flourish, a Brain Bus program, and a special business writing workshop hosted by Meg Files.

May


May was the month for long-term projects. The design team has been working with staff member Stephanie at the Juvenile Detention Center as well as local writer Marge Pelligrino to reshape last year's Field Notes into a four-volume project. There wil be a volume released every year for four years so that older teens moving through the program will have a complete set by the time they leave school. This has required extensive rewriting by Marge and some redesigning to make each volume

unique and visually appealing. Carolina has also been creating hand-drawn digital art for this year's One Seed Program. This

type of work takes time to do, so the work started now in order to be ready by the fall. Design also included Smart Elections workshop, Sarah T. Dubb book launch, and digital assets for the website.

April

In April, the web team presented the Library annual report on the home page, spotlighting compelling narratives from our patrons that underscore the profound impact of library services. These stories vividly depict how library resources and programs enrich and transform the lives of individuals within our community. Through this showcase, the website celebrates the enduring value of our institution and inspire continued support for our mission to serve and empower all members of our diverse community.

Additionally, the PCPL Web Team started preparations for May's observances of Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month, Jewish Heritage Month, and Mental Health Awareness Month. This included <u>curating specialized booklists</u> and resources that are featured throughout the month of May. This preparatory work included collaborations with library affinity teams <u>Biblio Lotus</u> and <u>Synapse</u> to ensure the accuracy and relevance of the materials provided. These initiatives are part of PCPL's broader commitment to celebrating diversity, fostering inclusivity, and promoting the well-being of our community members.

May

The newly redesigned <u>Seed Library</u> webpage, with a focus on improving accessibility and user experience launched. This work will continue throughout the year, as we continue to update seed library card images to reflect the updated Seed Library branding. This update is part of a broader effort to promote sustainable gardening and local food production within the community.

Additionally, May marked the opening of submissions for community presentations at local library branches. A <u>new dedicated page</u> was created to guide community members through the submission process, providing comprehensive instructions, criteria, and resources to support successful proposals. This initiative, prominently featured on the homepage, aims to maximize visibility and participation. It precedes the Pre-Proposal Conference on May 21, which offers further guidance and support for potential presenters, ensuring a diverse range of community-led programs.
